$9^{\text {th }}$ Grade Academic Course Placement Guidelines

- Placement for core academic class are based on $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Fall Semester Grades and MAP test scores.
- Students have been entered into the highest level courses they qualify for based on Rising 9th Grade Placement Guidelines.
- If you WERE NOT PLACED in an Honors or AP level class, then your grades and/or tests scores did not meet the requirements for the class and ARE NOT ELIGIBILE for those classes next year.
- If you have been placed in an Honors or AP level class and want to go down a level, he/she may submit a change request during the Add/Drop period in March

ATTENTION ! PLEASE!

IMPORTANT NOTE for students who have taken ANY World Language classes in grades 6, 7 \&/or 8:

- If you took and passed French or Spanish at Sutton you have already earned HS course credit for those classes.
- Students CANNOT repeat the same level class in HS once HS course credit has been awarded
- Students will be required to proceed to the next higher-level class in that language or select a new language to begin at Level 1 in 9th grade.

## Students who took Spanish or French all 3 years off MS:

- Spanish or French in 6th Grade $=1.0$ Credit for Level 1
- Spanish or French in 7th Grade $=.5$ Credit for Level 2 Part A
- Spanish or French in 8th Grade $=.5$ Credit for Level 2 Part B
- Students can either go into *Level 3* of the same language or Level 1 of a new language


## Students who took Spanish or French in 6th Grade only:

- Spanish or French in 6th Grade $=1.0$ Credit for Level 1
- Students have been removed from language for 2 years and are recommended to take Level 1 of a new language


## Students taking Spanish or French in 8th Grade Only

- Spanish or French in 8th Grade Only = 1.0 Credit for Level 1
- Students can either go into Level 2 of the same language or Level 1 of a new language


## LEVEL 3 WORLD LANGUAGE CLASSES: POINTS TO CONSIDER

- All instruction is delivered in the language of the class.
- Teachers ARE NOT speaking English in class.
- Students are expected to be sufficiently fluent to comprehend and communicate at this level.
- 9th Grade students who do not have a strong foundation in their language typically find the class to be too difficult and struggle with being successful at this level.

## AP Human Geography (Elective)



- AP Classes are equivalent to college level course
- This IS NOT a class required to graduate; it is an ELECTIVE class that students choose to take
- Students DO NOT have to be in Gifted program
- Any student who is willing to work hard and has strong reading comprehension skills may be good fit
- Class is Extremely rigorous; Strong work ethic, time and organizational skills are critical for students to be successful in this class
- Students who take the class are expected to take the AP Exam in May (paid for by students)
- Final passing grades are weighted 10 points on transcript; Failing grades are not weighted
*Students who meet class requirements have AP Human added to their course request form.
*Students/Parents may decline taking the class via the Add/Drop period in March.


## When Making Your Course Selections...

- You are encouraged to take the most rigorous courses you can AND be successful in ALL of them.
- Look at your class schedule by each subject area AND as a whole. Consider the combined workload for all 8 classes together.
- You will have homework that you need to take HDME. You will not be able to get all your classwark dane during the school day.
- Factor in sports and extracurricular activities that may demand a lot of your time outside the school day.
- Review the caurse descriptions tharoughly so you know exactly what you are signing up far.
- Select classes that match your personal and career interests. ID NDT select classes because your friend(s) signed up for them.
Remember there are NO SCHEDULE CHANGES in August or January!!!

There will be NO SCHEDULE CHANGES IN AUGUST!

## Scheduling Rules \& Process



- Students must have a total of 8 classes per semester (there are no free periods or study halls)
- All single semester classes must be paired with another semester class
- Yearlong classes cannot be changed mid-year after fall semester
- Students cannot request the term in which term they will have a single semester class
- Students cannot request to have a particular lunch period
- WE CANNOT GUARANIEE a student's top elective choice(s) will be granted, but we will do our best!
- Course requests ARE NOT a schedule. Classes listed on course requests in Infinite Campus this spring are not guaranteed to make it onto a student's final schedule in August.
- Final schedules will not be available for students/parents until midsummer.
