Community

North Atlanta High School is one of the 18 high schools in the Atlanta Public Schools system, a district that serves over 49,000 students residing in the urban core of Atlanta, Georgia. A 1991 merger of the former North Fulton High School and Northside High School resulted in the creation of North Atlanta High School, currently located on Northside Parkway in the Buckhead neighborhood of Atlanta. Classes are held in a renovated modern office tower just west of the Buckhead business district, though the student population encompasses a vast socioeconomic spectrum that mirrors the demographics of the city and of the state.

NORTH ATLANTA HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM

CLASS SCHEDULE

- NAHS operates on a two-semester system with each semester being 18 weeks. There are a total of 8 courses a student takes in a year via a 4 x 8 schedule model.
- Each course meets every other day (an A/B day rotation) and carries .5 unit of credit upon successful completion
 of the semester.
- It is possible to earn 4.0 units of credit per semester, or a total of 8.0 units per year, if all classes are successfully completed. During the 4 years (8 semesters) of high school, students may earn a total of 32 units of credit.

CLASS SCHEDULE CHANGES for 2020-2021 School Year Only

In response to the impact of COVID-19, Atlanta Public Schools opened the school year in a fully digital learning environment. In February 2021, the district moved to a blended learning model offering both in-person and digital learning. Students and families were given the option to return to the building for in-person instruction or continue with full time virtual instruction. As a result, the district implemented system wide changes for all high school student schedules and grading practices for the 2020-21 school year.

- NAHS operated on a 4 Term quarter system with each term being 9 weeks. There were a total of 4 courses a student takes in each term via a 4x4 block schedule model.
- Each course met every day and carried a .5 unit of credit upon successful completion of the term.
- It was possible to earn 2.0 units of credit per term or a total of 8.0 units per year if all classes were successfully completed.

The district returned to traditional face to face instruction for the 2021-22 school year.

ACADEMICS

North Atlanta High School offers a diverse curriculum designed to meet the individual needs of students who are seeking a challenging college preparatory experience.

- International Baccalaureate Programme: NAHS is an International Baccalaureate World School with a fully authorized Middle Years Program, encompassing all 9th and 10th grade students. We also offer the IB Diploma Programme and IB Career-Related Program. Baseline admission criteria include an 85 average in core classes in grades 9 and 10; minimum Lexile 1150; successful completion of the MYP Personal Project.
- Advanced Placement Program: NAHS offers a variety of Advanced Placement courses in many subjects.
 Students must meet prerequisites based on a combination of set criteria specific to each course in order to be accepted into an Advanced Placement.
- <u>Dual Enrollment</u>: The dual enrollment program provides students the opportunity to be enrolled in high school and college earning both high school and college course credits simultaneously. To participate, a student must first apply and be admitted into the dual enrollment program by the college or university.

CLASS RANK

- Class rank is calculated using the cumulative, weighted numerical grade point average.
- Unofficial class rank will be released in the fall semester of senior year
- Class rank determining valedictorian and salutatorian will be calculated after 1st semester grades of senior year are finalized and will be released in February of senior year
- Class rank is not final or official until a student has completed all graduation requirements.

GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Numeric Grade Averages on a 100-point Scale (NGA)

- NGAs are the official GPA used in Atlanta Public Schools
- NGAs are calculated on a 100-point scale using the final numerical grades from all attempted high school credit bearing courses.
- High school level courses taken in middle-school are included on the transcript, but are not be factored into the NGA
- Unweighted NGAs do not include the 10 honors points which are subtracted before the calculation.
- The weighted NGA is the average used to calculate class rank, including valedictorian and salutatorian

Grade Point Averages w/Quality Points (GPA)

- Conversion of numeric grades to quality point scores includes high school credit courses taken in grades 9-12.
- The quality point GPA score is calculated as a support to students as they apply to colleges and/or universities.
