IB Diploma Programme (IBDP)

- Prepares students for success in higher education and to be active participants in a global society (Most rigorous academic program at NAHS)
- · Can earn college course credit for passing scores on IB exams
- · 2 Year Program; starts at beginning of Junior Year
- Students take total of 7 IB courses covering all subject areas
- Requirements: 87+ GPA in Core Classes; 500+ PSAT Reading/Writing Score; 2+ years of World Language; 5+ score on Middle Years Project

IB Career Related Programme (IBCP)

- Prepares students for success in higher education and to follow their chosen pathways in life (Highly rigorous academic program)
- · Can earn college course credit for passing scores on IB exams
- 2 Year Program; starts at beginning of Junior Year
- Students take a minimum of 3 IB courses and Pathway classes
- Requirements: 87+ GPA in Core and Pathway Classes; 500+ PSAT Reading/Writing Score; 5+ score on Middle Years Project; Minimum 1-2 yrs in an IBCP authorized pathway

Individual IB or Advanced Placement (AP) Courses

- Opportunity for students to take AP or IB courses without being part of the IBDP or IBCP
- Can earn college course credit for passing scores on IB and AP exams
- IB classes are 2 years long starting Junior Year
- AP classes are 1 year long and are offered in grades 9-12
- IB Class Requirements: 87+ GPA in subject area & teacher recommendation; 500+ PSAT Reading/Writing Score; 5+ score on Middle Years Project
- AP Class Requirements: Vary by class and subject area; See NAHS Academic Planner for details

Dual Enrollment Program (DE)

- Opportunity for qualified students to take college classes on the college campus while earning both college and HS course credit towards graduation
- · College Tuition/Books are free up to 30 Course Credit Hours
- · Can earn college course credit for passing college classes
- · Students can participate Junior and/or Senior year
- Requirements: Varies by College and requires students apply to and be accepted by the college; Admission typically includes minimum core GPAs and Test Scores (SAT, ACT, ACCUPLACER)

Atlanta College & Career Academy (ACCA)

- APS program providing opportunity for students to complete a 1 year CTE accelerated pathway, which directly aligns with high skill/high demand technical career fields in Atlanta
- · Can lead to industry recognized credentials/certifications and employability skills
- · 13 Pathway offerings are not available on NAHS campus
- · Students can participate Junior and/or Senior year
- Requirements: On Track to Graduate & On Grade Level; 2.0+ GPA; Have room in NAHS schedule for 4 Period block of ACCA

Work Based Learning (WBL)

- Opportunity for students to gain hands-on work and career industry experience thru internships and youth apprenticeships
- Students in IBCP who complete their CTE pathway at end of Junior year will be required to participate in WBL senior year
- · Students can participate Junior and/or Senior year
- Requirements: On Track to Graduate (On Grade Level); 16 years old; Completed CTE pathway or be enrolled in the 3rd level pathway course; Have room in Class Schedule for at least 3 Periods of WBL

Atlanta Virtual Academy (AVA)

- · Offers Self-Paced, asynchronous online classes for APS Students
- Can take Initial Credit classes to make room for other classes in NAHS schedule
- Can take Credit Recovery classes for failed classes required for graduation
- · Classes start at beginning of each Fall, Spring and Summer semesters
- Available to students in grades 9-12
- Requirements: Approval from Your School Counselor
