




IB MYP Personal Project

All students in the 9th and 10th grade are IB students.

The Personal Project is:

- a required culminating project for the IB MYP
- a requirement for eligibility for DP/ CP courses
- a formative and summative grade in CORE courses

MYP= Middle Years Programme
DP= Diploma Programme
CP= Career-related Programme



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

How can I get college credit while in high school?

- 1. <u>AP or IB DP/CP</u>: high school credit and you may earn college credit based on examination score for AP and internal assessment with exam scores for IB
- 2. <u>Dual enrollment</u>- full or part-time academic college courses: high school and college credit
- 3. <u>Dual enrollment/HOPE Grant Technical program</u>: high school and college credit
- 4. Atlanta College Career Academy (ACCA):

Which one should I choose? DP or CP?

It all depends on your interests....

Both are academic and rigorous

DP has a minimum 7 IB classes for 2 years

CP has a minimum 3 IB classes for 2 years

DP and CP students are in the same IB academic classes

Both are PROGRAMS

= complete core
service learning &
major writing
assignments

CP, however, is
different = must
continue a pathway
during junior/senior
year

Students who really enjoy their pathway often choose CP over DP



What are the requirements to enter DP or CP?

<u>DP</u>

- 87% + in core & Language class
- 5 or higher on the Personal Project and it must be turned in on the due date ***
- Minimum PSAT ***
 reading/writing score of 500
- 2 years of the same Foreign Language


<u>CP</u>

- 87% + in core & pathway* class
- 5 or higher on the Personal Project and it must be turned in on the due date***
- Minimum PSAT *** reading/writing score of 500
- Must be on a pathway* already

LANGUAGE ARTS: 4 CREDITS

- 9th Grade Lit*
- 10th Grade Lit

MATHEMATICS: 4 CREDITS

- Algebra 1*
- Geometry*
- Algebra 2*
- 4th Core Math Course

SCIENCE: 4 CREDITS

- Biology*
- Physical Science* or Physics
- Chemistry or Environmental Sci or Earth Systems or AP/IB Science
- 4th Core Science Course

SOCIAL STUDIES: 3 CREDITS

- American Govt (.5 Credit)
- World History
- US History*
- Economics* (.5 Credit)

WORLD LANGUAGE (WL): 2 CREDITS

- Minimum of 2 credits of the same language (equivalency)
- Recommended 3 credits taken in HS for college admissions

PATHWAY CAREER-TECH/FINE ARTS/WL: 1 CREDIT

- Pathway Completion requires 3 credits in the same career tech or fine arts program
- Pathway completion is pre-requisite for Work-Based Learning and IB Career-related Program (IB-CP).

PHYS ED/HEALTH: 1.5 CREDITS

- Health (.5 Credit)
- Personal Fitness (.5 Credit)
- Phys Ed Elective (.5 Credit)

WAIVERS for Phys Ed/Health:

- 3 years of JROTC- waives Health and Personal Fitness
- 2 years of Varsity Sport-waives Physical Education
- 1 year of Advanced Band- waives Physical Education

ELECTIVES: 4 CREDITS: 2 units related to thematic pathway

Your semester GPA is located at the bottom of each term

So which GPA do colleges use?



There is no single standard GPA calculation method in college admissions. Each college has their own GPA calculation criteria.

- Weighted GPA: include 10 honors pts for AP, IB and DE courses
- <u>Unweighted GPA</u>: does not include the 10 Honors pts
- **Cumulative GPA**: includes ALL subjects
- <u>Core GPA</u>: includes only Lang Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies & World Language

My High School HOPE GPA

Your Georgia high school HOPE GPA starts calculating as soon as you begin 9th grade.

Unlike your overall high school GPA, your HOPE GPA only includes your core curriculum courses and course numbers:

- •English (23.xxx)
- •Math (27.xxx)
- •Science (26.xxx and 40.xxx)
- •Social Studies (45.xxx)
- •World Language (60-65.xxx)

- ► HOPE Scholarship Must have a 3.0 cumulative average in academic classes (LA, Math, Sci, SS, World Lang
- Zell Miller Scholarship 3.7 GPA and 1200 SAT or 26 ACT – full tuition to an eligible public college/university
- Rigor requirements met through our sequence of college prep classes

Scheduling Timeline

- Jan 19- 26: Students complete the Course Program Intent Form
- Jan 30 Mar 10: Counselors will meet with students either individually or in small groups to select courses for next year.
- Feb 17: Dual Enrollment (DE) Information Session & Letter of Intent Contract
 Deadline Students interested in applying for DE are required to submit
 completed and signed contract to Ms. Marino either electronically or hard copy.
 Students also must have attended or viewed the DE info session (Nov 21) and
 verify attendance via Google Form.

Timeline Cont'd.

- March 15-17: Drop/Add via Google Form. This will be the only time to request a course change.
- March 22- 23: Students and parents who submitted a Drop/Add request should check the Portal for changes. Directions will be published.
 Changes are final on March 24.

Counseling Tips:

- Students should create a professional email account
- Students should use their legal name (not nickname) when completing applications, school forms etc.
- Students should keep personal copy of documents submitted to school staff
- Ensure that your student's social security card/number are not restricted from the school record- (issues with hope, hope gpa, dual enrollment, scholarships)
- Encourage self-advocacy, problem solving, positive decision making
