- Level 3 Classes*: Students who have an A-B average in Level 1 \& Level 2 classes taken throughout $6^{\text {th }}, 7^{\text {th }}$ and $^{\text {ath }}$ grade. In Level 3 World Language classes all instruction is delivered in the language of the class and teachers ARE NOT speaking English. Students are expected to be sufficiently fluent to comprehend and communicate verbally and in writing. 9th Grade students who do not have a strong foundation in their language typically find Level 3 classes to be too difficult and struggle with being successful.
