



- Majority of classes students take are yearlong: Fall Semester (Part A) Spring Semester (Part B)
- Some classes are only 1
 semester in length
 (Fall or Spring term only)
- A complete HS Class Schedule contains 8 classes each semester

APS COMMUNITY SERVICE GRAD REQUIREMENT <u>GUIDELINE UPDATES</u> (EFFECTIVE DEC 1 2022)

APS students are required to complete a **total of 75 volunteer community service hours** to meet APS graduation requirements.

Students cannot earn credit for service hours completed prior to the 1st day of freshman year

ANY ACTIVITY or TASK THAT MEETS <u>ALL</u> OF THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA...

Is for the benefit of others



Is not related to routine tasks/requirements that students are invited or expected to do



Is not self-serving and directly benefits one or more individuals



It is unpaid (no compensation of money or gifts)



Does not occur during instructional time (unless planned as part of NAHS preapproved school activity)



Is meaningful & contributes to the betterment of a school or non-profit organization


4 x 8 Block Schedule

Academic placement determined today will be made based on the information available to us at this time.

Middle School academic records, current courses, grades, & standardized scores (if available).

Academic placements selected today will be tentative.

Student academic placement will be verified once officially enrolled

- Final 8th grade year report cards/transcripts and standardized scores (if available) should be uploaded in the APS enrollment application
- Uploaded documents will be reviewed for comparable evidence that NAHS placement guidelines/pre-reqs for pre-selected classes have been met
- Final course level placements will be determined in accordance with direction from the APS Office of Secondary Curriculum as needed.

If a student is academically misplaced, schedules adjustments must be made in within the 1st 10 days of school.



Important Differences Between Middle School & High School Course Placement

There are no "Tracks" in HS

- There is no "Honors Track" or "IB Track" (Remember <u>ALL</u> 9th & 10th Graders are in the IB MYP Program)
- ANY student who meets the pre-requisite for an Honors or AP class may take the class
- A student's classification (Gifted, DLI, ESOL, Spec Ed) DOES NOT....
 - Automatically predetermine the level of classes in which he/she is placed
 - Preclude a student from being eligible/ineligible to take higher level classes
 - Exclude a student from being required to take a support level class if deemed necessary
- Placement for each subject is reviewed and determined separately



When Making Your Course Selections...

• You are encouraged to take the most rigorous courses you can <u>AND</u> be successful in <u>ALL</u> of them.

- Look at your class schedule by each subject area AND as a whole. Consider the combined workload for all 8 classes together.
- You will have homework that you need to take HOME. You will not be able to get all your classwork done during the school day.
- Factor in sports and extracurricular activities that may demand a lot of your time outside the school day.
- Review the course descriptions thoroughly so you know exactly what you are signing up for.
- Select classes that match your personal and career interests. DO NOT select classes because your friend(s) signed up for them.
- Remember there are NO SCHEDULE CHANGES in August or January!!!



- Score of Beginning or Developing on the MAP Math assessment
 - Algebra Support is an academic elective class for students scoring in this range
 - Support class is paired with Algebra class; Students will have Math every day

Fast Track Math: North Atlanta's Math Acceleration Program

- The purpose of this program is to expose students to Calculus before they leave high school.
- Students take a double block of Math classes for in their schedule.
- Classes cover the content of 2 year long math classes in 1 school year

How to Sign Up for the Fast Track Qualifying Test:

- After spring break, eligible students/parents should email **Dr Angela Mitchell at** <u>ammitchell@apsk12.org</u>
- The qualifying assessment will be given the Tuesday after Memorial Day.
- Selected students/parents will be notified via email and have an opportunity to accept or decline invitation to take the Fast Track class.
- Students who accept will make necessary revisions to freshman year classes at that time.

- Score of Proficient or Distinguished on MAP ELA Reading assessment

Social Studies Placement Guidelines



All 9th Graders are required to take both:

American Govt (1 Semester)

US & World Affairs* (1 Semester)

*US/World Affairs is an IB MYP required class

There are no Honors level offered for these classes

Health & Phys Ed



All 9th graders will take 1 semester of Personal Fitness and 1 semester of Health

Both classes are state graduation requirements and IB MYP required classes

- Students who have taken a World Language class in MS and received HS course credit cannot retake the same level class of the same language.
- Students may select to take the next higher-level class in their current language (if offered) or select a new language to begin at Level 1 in 9th grade.

LEVEL 3 WORLD LANGUAGE CLASSES: POINTS TO CONSIDER

- All instruction is delivered in the language of the class.
- Teachers <u>ARE NOT</u> speaking English in class.
- Students are expected to be sufficiently fluent to comprehend and communicate at this level.
- 9th Grade students who do not have a strong foundation in their language typically find the class to be too difficult and struggle with being successful at this level.

NAHS Pathway Programs

Pathway programs are a series of 3 sequential courses focusing on a career tech/fine arts area of study

- Pathways introduce students to knowledge, skills and possible future college majors and careers in related fields
- Completion of some pathways may allow students to earn industry recognized credentials or certifications
- Students are expected to complete at least 1 pathway sequence by graduation

AP Human Geography (Elective)

Pre-Requisite

- 90+ in Advanced/Gifted/DLI Lang Arts or 95+ in on-level 8th Grade Lang Arts
- 90+ in 8th Grade Social Studies
- 1200 Lexile Score
- 85th percentile <u>or</u> higher on a nationally-normed test in Soc St OR Distinguished performance on Fall MAP ELA/Reading Assessment



Factors to Consider With Taking AP Classes


- AP Classes are equivalent to college level course
- This IS NOT a class required to graduate; it is an ELECTIVE class that students choose to take

Students DO NOT have to be in Gifted program

- Any student who meets the requirements and is willing to work hard and has strong reading comprehension skills may be good fit
- Class is Extremely rigorous; Strong work ethic, time and organizational skills are critical for students to be successful in this class
- Student should expect 3-5 hours of homework per week
- Students who take the class are expected to take the AP Exam in May (paid for by students)
- Final passing grades are weighted 10 points on transcript; Failing grades are not weighted

APS/NAHS Enrollment Process for 2024-25

STEP 1: APS Online Enrollment Application

- Application for the 2024-25 school year will open on June 1
- Highly recommended to submit application before July 1 (the sooner the better)
- Upload final 8th Grade report card & official transcript with any earned HS course credits

STEP 2: Application Review Process

- Registrar processes enrollment applications in the order in which they are received
- Residency Officer verifies address & proof of residency documents
- Counselor notified when enrollment is approved and has been entered in Infinite Campus

STEP 3: Student Scheduling Process

- Counselor refers to Pre-Registration Course Request Form completed today
- Uploaded 8th grade academic records reviewed to verify placement guidelines are met
- Counselor will contact parent when student has been scheduled & may start school

Transferring High School Course Credits

- If a student took HS level classes in MS and is awarded HS course credit by the school they attended, those credits will transfer to student's NAHS academic record & transcript
 - Student/Parent must provide an official transcript from the school awarding the course credit(s).
 - The transcript must show the credit(s) earned and include a final letter or numeric grade
 - If the class the student took was advanced or honors, no weights or honors points will be assigned to the transfer grades (APS policy)
- If a student took a HS course in MS and the school attended does not award HS course credit or is unable to provide an official transcript, then NAHS <u>cannot</u> accept or award course credit
 - If a student took Algebra 1 in MS, but was not awarded credit, academic placement for Math will be determined in consultation with the APS Secondary Math Coordinator and NAHS Math administrator


