

### **MIDDLE SCHOOL VS HIGH SCHOOL** ~KEY DIFFERENCES YOU NEED TO KNOW~

#### Differences In...

- Class
   Placement
- 2. Grading Periods
- 3. Promotion
- <mark>4</mark>. GPAs
- 5. GA Milestone Tests

### Middle School

- Class placements are based on academic tracks (i.e. Gifted, Advanced, On-Level)
- 2. 9 Week Grading Periods w/Report Cards
- 3. Students are promoted to the next grade at the end of each year
- No MS grades are counted in a student's GPA (even if HS credit was earned)
- 5. Students take GA Milestones every year in all subjects

#### **High School**

- 1. <u>ANY</u> student who <u>meets the pre-requisites</u> can take Honors, AP or IB classes
- 2. Only <u>2 Semester Grading Periods</u> (Fall: Aug-Dec & Spring: Jan-May); Final semester grades determine if course credit is earned for that term.
- 3. Grade level promotion is purely based on the **total # of course credits earned**
- **4.** <u>ALL</u> attempted HS classes are counted in a student's GPA
- 5. Students only take a GA Milestone when taking a class with an End of Course Test



### HS GRADING, CREDITS & PROMOTION PROCEDURES

### **Grading**

- 1 Semester class = .5 credit
- 1Yearlong class = 1 credit (.5 credit earned each semester)
- 8 total classes per semester = 4.0 total credits
- A final semester grade of 70+ is required to pass a class and earn credit for that term (grades are not averaged across semesters)
- A passing final grade in AP, IB and Dual Enrollment classes will be weighted 10 points

#### GA End of Course Tests (EOCs)

EOC scores count as <u>20% of final grade</u> in the class
EOC Courses:

- ELA: 11th Grade/Amer Lit
- <u>Math</u>: Algebra 1
- <u>Science</u>: Biology
- <u>SocSt</u>: US History

#### **Grade Level Promotion & Placement**

- Promotion based on total # of earned credits at the start of each school year
- Total # of credits needed to be promoted
  - <u>9th Grade</u>: <5.5 credits
  - <u>10th Grade</u>: 6 credits
  - <u>11th Grade</u>: 12 credits
  - <u>12th Grade</u>: 18 credits

### APS Community Service Requirement: 75 Total Volunteer Hours

#### **APS Service Hour Guidelines**

- An act that directly benefits one or more other individuals via a non-profit organization
- Does not occur during instructional time (unless planned as part of a large school activity)
- Is not related to routine tasks or requirements that students are expected to complete
- Does not result in compensation (monetary or otherwise)
- Is meaningful or contributes to the betterment of the school or larger surrounding community

#### Students are responsible for...

- Completing all 75 Hours by December of senior year deadline
- Completing 20-25 service hours each year starting in 9<sup>th</sup> grade
- Verifying and logging their completed hours
- Tracking their progress towards completing all 75 required service hours
- APS will verify completion of service hour requirement based on the # of hours reflected students' MyVoluntier account.



Find your own volunteer opportunities with non-profit organizations and provide documentation from the organization verifying your completed hours.

- Address of Organization
- Dates and Hours of Service
- Total Hours of Service Completed
- Brief description of service tasks completed
- Signature of the Organizer

APS will review letter and log hours into student's MyVoluntier account once information has been verified.

- · Scan or take a picture of the document and upload it to this form
- Provide your personal email on this form
- You will receive an email receipt at the address you provide confirming your submission has gone through.
- Your hours should be reflected in your MyVoluntier account in approximately 2 weeks from the date submitted
- Save all original documents



- Final grade for each course •
- Credits earned (per class, semester and total) ٠
- GPAs (weighted and unweighted) ۲
- Class rank •

#### PLEASE NOTE ...

- Freshman GPAs begin with current fall semester final grades
- NONE of the GPAs listed on APS Transcripts are HOPE GPAs
- Students/Parents can request an e-copy of their transcript on Parchment.com after 1<sup>st</sup> semester grades have been posted

Students & parent should <u>review 10th grade</u> <u>course placement guidelines now</u> while fall semester grades are still in progress.

Students cannot rely on spring semester grades to qualify into an honors/AP class.

### NAVIGATING THE PARENT PORTAL

- ASSIGNMENTS: View graded and assigned classwork
  - Click 'Missing' for a list of assignments, quizzes, tests not completed (zeros).
- GRADES: View current average for each class, all graded work, tests, & quizzes entered into teachers' gradebook
- GRADE BOOK UPDATES: Most recent teacher gradebook entries
- **ATTENDANCE**: View absences & tardies by day, class and period
- **SCHEDULE**: Student's current A Day and B Day class schedule
  - Term 1-2 are Fall; Term 3-4 are Spring
- ACADEMIC PLAN: Student's projected post-secondary plan after HS
- DOCUMENTS: View/Download Progress Reports & Report Cards

### Which "Grade" Should I Be Looking at?

- <u>Semester Grade</u>: A student's current and live average grade for the class
- <u>Progress Grades</u>: A snapshot of a student's grade at the 6-week or 12-week mark of the semester
- <u>Mid-Semester Grade</u>: A snapshot of a student's grade at the mid-way point of the semester



# Teachers should be your 1<sup>st</sup> point of contact for...

- questions about the class
- expressing concerns/addressing issues
- feedback & suggestions for improvement
- a better understanding of class expectations

Working collaboratively with teachers creates a team approach to finding solutions & developing a plan for student success!

#### **Conference with an Individual Teachers**

- Parent contacts the teacher directly to schedule a meeting
- If no response from teacher after 48 business hours, contact your school counselor for assistance

#### Conference with 3 or more Teachers

- All conferences take place on Wednesdays at 4pm via Zoom
- Parents request a conference thru the online Sign-Up Google Form
- Parents need to submit your request in advance; Limited of 20 conference slots per week

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

### <u>A few reasons for students</u> to attend teacher tutorials:

- Struggling to keep up or get caught up in a class
- Having difficulty understanding the content
- Needing help to complete an assignment or project
- Not performing well on quizzes and/or tests
- Absent for class/missed instruction



- Every teacher has scheduled tutorial days & times for students to go in for extra help
- Teacher tutorial days/times are posted in Google Classrooms
- Students may seek help from other teachers in the same content area
- If your student cannot attend the tutorial days/times, work with the teacher to find an alternative day/time or go to another teacher

### ACADEMIC SUPPORT OPPORTUNITIES

### **Mastery Opportunities**

Students may request to retake summative assessments for any test they wish to show mastery (Mastery is ≥80%)



- Students must initiate the request with teacher
- Students have up to TWO WEEKS from the date they are issued their initial grade to either retest
- Students must attend at least ONE TUTORIAL with the teacher before the retest
- The student will receive the higher grade of the two
- Retests taken after the 2-week grace period will be assessed a 20% deduction off the grade earned (maximum grade of 80%)

### NAHS LATE WORK POLICY: <u>REVISED JULY 2023</u>





#### Late formative assignments for <u>UNEXCUSED</u> absences:

- Assignments turned in after the due date can earn a maximum of 80%.
- From the first late day, late work will have a 20% deduction off the grade earned.
- An additional 20% grade deduction for every 10 calendar days the assignment is late.

#### Late formative assignments for <u>EXCUSED</u> absences:

- Students have a 2-week grace period to take the missing assessment for full credit
- Missing assignments taken after the 2-week grace period will have a 20% deduction off the grade earned (maximum of 80%)
- An additional 20% grade deduction for every additional 10 calendar days the assignment is late.

#### **Grade Deduction Chart:**

1 – 10 Days Late Max Grade: 80%
11 – 20 Days Late Max Grade: 60%
21 – 30 Days Late Max Grade: 40%
31+ Days Late Max Grade: 20%

### **Reporting Absences to NAHS**

- Parents/Guardians must provide a written & signed note for the absence
- Students turn in the note to the Attendance Clerk (2<sup>nd</sup> floor next to the main office)
- If students do not provide a parent note, they will be marked UNEXCUSED (UNX)

Why this is important... Students with EXCUSED absences must be allowed to make up work assigned during their absence <u>without penalty</u>.

<u>STUDENTS</u> are responsible for following up with teachers about making up tests, class work, etc. after their absences.
